Consider Adding a Grade 4-5 Endorsement to K-3 Licenses

For Teachers with Ohio K-3 only Candidates must complete an approved program offered by an approved Ohio college or university educator preparation program consisting of a minimum of nine semester hours of additional college coursework (beyond what is required for the Early Childhood Education P-3 Licensure) aligned with the Ohio Academic Content Standards for grades four and five, including preparation in pedagogy and child/adolescent development appropriate for grades four and five; and, pass the Praxis II subject assessment test #0014, Elementary Education: Content Knowledge, upon program completion. For Teachers Holding K-5/K-6 license in another state

Candidates who were prepared as elementary teachers in other states and who received a broader elementary license in the originating state but were required to obtain a P-3 license in Ohio, now will be able to apply for the new early childhood generalist endorsement based on the preparation they initially received in their originating state. While these educators will *not* need to complete additional coursework requirements through an Ohio college or university, they are required to meet the Praxis II testing requirement.
