# OUR THANKS TO YOU!

Thank you for your support of CISE. Here are some highlights from 2017 made possible through the generosity of our donors. We couldn't do it without you!

## STRATEGIC PLAN

Early in 2016, CISE completed a five-year strategic plan. Improved academic performance continues to be a primary focus. Toward that end, we are investing in our summer programs, classroom instruction, co-curricular opportunities, professional development for teachers and the high school program.

## SCHOOL NURSE PROGRAM

The mental and physical health of our students was identified by our principals as the greatest barrier to learning in our schools. Thanks to the strength of the CISE campaign in recent years, we have been able to invest in a full-time school nurse in each CISE school. These kinds of initiatives demonstrate what we mean when we say we educate the whole child.

## PRESCHOOL PROGRAM

There are now 10 preschool classrooms in the CISE schools. Two of the CISE preschools earned a five-star rating from the Ohio Department of Education's "Step Up to Quality" program. All our other preschools are on track to receive this rating. Our goal is to have a 100% kindergarten-ready population coming into the CISE schools.

## ELEMENTARY SCHOOL SUCCESS

95% of CISE students passed the Third Grade Reading Guarantee. To put this in perspective, every year more than 80% of low-income third graders in the United States are unable to read at grade level, which is the most critical predictor of high school graduation and career success.

## POWER PACK PROGRAM

Each Friday, a bag of shelf-stable food items is quietly tucked into the backpacks of 192 of our most food-insecure students. CISE collaborates with the Freestore Foodbank to provide this important service to our students.

## HIGH SCHOOL SUCCESS

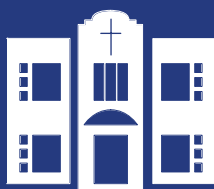
In 2017, 300+ CISE students benefited from the CISE high school program. With help from generous donors, students who graduate from a CISE elementary school are supported in their efforts to continue their education at a local Catholic high school. 89% of CISE students who graduate from Catholic high school are accepted into college.
