The Leader offers petitions. **Begin with these words, or make up your own:** *Jesus, you are the King of the universe. We pray for (name of pilgrim) and all the NCYC pilgrims. All respond: "Lord, hear our prayer."* The leader asks if others have petitions they'd like to share. After each petition, the family responds "Lord, hear our prayer." (Petitions may include: sending prayers of blessing to your pilgrim; petitions for their safety while at NCYC; for the family to come closer to God; for special needs; for those who are sick or in trouble; for the needs of the world, etc.)

The Leader invites the whole family to pray the NCYC Pilgrim's Prayer. (Follow with the prayer for blessing the food if at mealtime)

Conclude with the Sign of the Cross
